The mission of the Foundation is to improve access to quality health care for underserved Asian Americans and other vulnerable populations. The Foundation raises money to support important programs at the Charles B. Wang Community Health Center that are not funded through conventional means like health insurance.

With your generous support, here is how the Foundation is improving access to quality health care:

We are making long-term investments in healthcare infrastructure that brings more care to more communities. Over the years, financial support from the Foundation has helped the Health Center to grow into bigger and better facilities, allowing us to serve more patients across New York. Most recently, our support helped finance a brand new health care site in Flushing, Queens which opened this past year.

We are supporting special clinical programs that improve people's health. The Foundation provides financial backing for numerous special clinical programs that deliver tailored interventions for higher-need patients. These programs supplement the high-quality care patients get in the doctor's office, providing extra help and support. These programs are typically unfunded or under-funded through conventional means like health insurance, but they measurably improve patient health outcomes.

CHCF scholarships are designed to help recipients at various stages of their career advance and develop new skills. Investments in Health Infrastructure

The Foundation funds modernization and expansion projects that bring high-quality care to more people. Recently, the Foundation helped finance the construction of a brand new health care site in Flushing, Queens operated by Charles B. Wang Community Health Center.



Special Clinical Programs

The Foundation provides financial backing for numerous special clinical programs that provide tailored interventions for higher-need patients. These programs are often unfunded or under-funded through conventional means, but they measurably improve patient health outcomes.



Developing Tomorrow's Community Health Workforce

Building for the Future

In November 2022, the Charles B. Wang Community Health Center opened its newest site, an 82,000 square-foot, state-of-the-art facility in Flushing. Adult Medicine, Dental, and Mental Health services are now available here, with additional services coming online in 2023.

The Chinatown Health Clinic Foundation made a substantial gift of \$10 million as well as a \$7.1m loan to support the land acquisition, construction, and outfitting of the new community health center site.



The Chinatown Health Clinic Foundation provides financial backing for a portfolio of special programs and community services administered by the Charles B. Wang Community Health Center.

These programs are not generally reimbursed through conventional means like health insurance. Your support ensures that higher-risk and higher-need patients receive extra tailored services above and beyond their normal doctor's visits.

Special Clinical Programs include tailored interventions for:

- Early childhood development
- Adolescent health
- Special needs children & families
- Mental health for mothers
- Refugee health
- Cardiovascular disease management
- Smoking cessation
- Cancer services
- Hepatitis B screening and management
- Sexual and reproductive health

Services for the Community include:

- Vaccination and education
- Health education
- Health promotion and outreach events
- Immigrant health initiatives
- Insurance enrollment
- Anti-racism initiatives



The Chinatown Health Clinic Foundation awards the Dickson Hee Scholarship, the Dr. Thomas Tam Scholarship, and the Helen Lee Scholarship to Charles B. Wang Community Health Center staff and local students. Through these scholarships, the Chinatown Health Clinic Foundation hopes to pave the way for young generations and front line staff of the Health Center to pursue academic opportunities and further their career in healthcare.

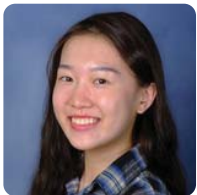

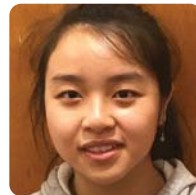

Cindy plans to examine the importance of working with underserved populations and ensure that they are included and protected.



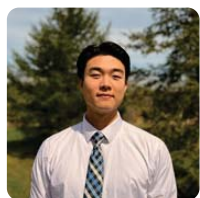

Samantha plans to pursue medical school and specialize in internal medicine, emergency medicine, or immunology.



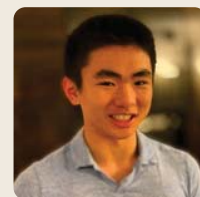
