As the world changes around us, the Chinatown Health Clinic Foundation remains committed to our mission in supporting community-based health care services to improve access to quality health care for underserved communities and other vulnerable populations. **Thanks to your contributions and support, the Foundation is making a difference in many people's lives.**

In 2019, the Chinatown Health Clinic Foundation supported community-based health care services, such as those provided by the Charles B. Wang Community Health Center (CBWCHC), which provided care through more than 300,000 patient visits.

High-Quality Health Care

The Healthview Project: *Expanding access to high-quality care in Queens*



About the “Healthview” Project

In 2019, the Chinatown Health Clinic Foundation made a substantial gift of \$10 million to support the land acquisition and construction of a brand new multi-story health care facility for the Charles B. Wang Community Health Center (CBWCHC). At approximately 80,000 square feet, this state-of-the-art, environmentally friendly building will expand CBWCHC’s award winning services. Aptly named the “Healthview” project, this primary care access point will meet the vital health needs of the rapidly growing neighborhood by providing important medical, dental, mental health, and enabling services for community residents. The site will serve as CBWCHC’s third location in Queens. Constructed on a designated brownfield site, this will be situated amid a lively and bustling retail, transportation, and residential hub in Flushing, Queens.

About the Charles B. Wang Community Health Center

Charles B. Wang Community Health Center (CBWCHC) has provided high quality, affordable, and culturally competent health care services to medically underserved communities since 1971. As a Federally Qualified Health Center and Patient-Centered Medical Home, CBWCHC ensures that all its patients, regardless of their ability to pay, are provided with comprehensive primary health care. The majority of its patients have lower income and frequently face cultural, linguistic, and insurance barriers when it comes to accessing health care.

Community Impact

Expanding high quality health care in Queens will create a lasting positive impact for the community and its residents. In addition, the new CBWCHC site would provide an option to pay using a sliding-fee scale for dental services, something rarely found at other dental facilities in the area. The site is projected to serve over 25,000 patients and create over 100 new jobs in the first three years of operation.

2019 Dickson Hee Scholarship Award Recipients

Zhi Ying (Emily) Shao is a health educator in the OB/GYN Department and has shown great commitment and passion to provide quality health education and counseling to patients and community members. Immigrating to the United States with her parents, Emily understands the cultural and linguistic barriers that often restrict immigrant populations from receiving appropriate care. With the support of the scholarship, Emily obtained her certification as a Certified Health Education Specialist (CHES) and plans to pursue a Master's degree in Public Health to ensure that communities have equal opportunities in health.

Xiaoyu (Sandy) Lu is the marketing and outreach associate of the Administration Department. As a bilingual speaker, Sandy regularly engages with community members and seniors at outreach events but has found limited capacity to translate medical terminologies. With the Dickson Hee Scholarship, Sandy has enrolled in a course to improve her skills as a Medical Interpreter so she can have rewarding conversations with the patients and community members she encounters.
